3. COUNCIL UPDATES

- A. Updates, questions, requests, comments from Mayor Sciascia, Councilmember Staton-Williams, and Councilmember Patrick

4. OLD BUSINESS

- A. **Tree giveaway:** Mark Allen to share updates and next steps.
- B. **National Drive Electric Week event recap:** Discuss 9/25 event and recommendation to host another event in April 2022 (around Earth Day) and/or in September 2022.
- C. **Identify opportunities within buildings, fleet vehicles, other equipment and operations:** To reduce energy consumption and improve health and environmental benefits. Scott Crew and Scott Noel to provide any updates. Discuss NC Sheriff Association EV information and scheduling a meeting with Town staff and Chris Davis at City of Charlotte. Need to assign a sub-committee of HSAB members to take point on this and engage key Town staff members (e.g. Lee, Brian, Rob, Jim, etc.).
- D. **Electrification of Town grounds maintenance equipment (e.g. mowers, blowers, trimmers):** Reduce operating costs and air and noise pollution. Scott Crew and Mark Allen to share any updates. Need to further engage Town staff (Adam Abernathy and Brian Lee mainly).
- E. **"Green Leaf" Program (business and residential):** Next steps: Any additional individual member feedback by Sunday, 10/17; Sub-committee (Noel, Crew, Huster, Leake?, anyone else?) to tighten up

approach/documents by 10/24; Then begin outreach/engagement with some Town staff, businesses (HBA on 10/28), and residents for feedback.
Goal is to officially launch in January 2022 (pre-promote in late Q4 2021 if possible).

- F. **HSAB-funded PurpleAir monitor in Pharr Mill Park:** Went live back in September. Discuss options to create awareness and importance of PHM and HP air quality monitors. (Also still need to pay CleanAIRE NC for second monitor).
- G. **Monitor air quality in Veteran's Park:** Ken Huster to share any updates. HSAB to also explore options to fund and install a permanent PurpleAir monitor in this park (currently no wifi available at this park). Need to assign an HSAB point person for this - including to engage the local VFW.
- H. **Wildlife in Harrisburg:** Follow up on previous discussions. Possibility to create designated wildlife zones/habitats/paths in existing and future neighborhoods? Need to engage state organizations (e.g. NC Wildlife Resources Commission) and interested, knowledgeable local residents.
- I. **Harrisburg water quality:** Discuss most recent TTHM quarterly and annual sample results at Harrisburg Industrial Park. Follow ups: Engage Town staff (Public Works) and other experts (local and state) on water quality information and education. (Need an HSAB member on point for this.)
- J. **Waste and recycling education:** Bins cannot be potentially replaced until 2024 (when current contract ends). Prioritize our focus on education around the existing bins (e.g. broader content; why it's important; CARTology and other platforms). Need an HSAB member to be on point.
- K. **HSAB Adopt-A-Street - Next Cleanup Date:** Scott Crew to share updates on Sept cleanup and discuss next cleanup date.

6. ADVISORY BOARD UPDATES

- A. **HSAB member term limits:** Four HSAB members' terms end on 12/31/21 (Allen, Morris, Leake, Hogg). There is a procedural change in how we need to proceed with this. Discuss it during this meeting and refer to email for more information. (Open to public for 30 days; current members will need to reapply; interviews; HSAB recommendations to Town Council for their final appointment approvals.)
- B. **SAB digital tools for communication, scheduling, planning, file sharing:** Discuss TeamReach app; the Town's new email addresses; and CivicClerk upgrades.
- C. **Possible creation of HSAB Subcommittees** (e.g. energy, electrification, waste, water, air, land, wildlife): Table for upcoming meetings.
